A community work day has been planned for Saturday March 7th at 7:30 a.m. Volunteers are asked to meet up at The Donelson Fellowship. Please arrive early as there are a lot of volunteers expected. Orientation will start at 7:30 a.m. with work projects from 8:00 a.m.- 4:30 p.m. There will be ways for minors to volunteer and childcare will be provided for parents who would like to participate in the work day as well. Keep in mind that a portion of McGavock Pike is still closed, so please plan your route accordingly.

Councilmember Kevin Rhoten has expressed a need for volunteers to help around the neighborhoods/streets around Dodson Chapel and Albee Drive. These residents have no power and he felt that it would be possibly weeks before it has returned. Most of the residents are renters and have stated they are not receiving help from their landlords. He also stated that most residents he met with in this area have English as their second language, so any volunteers that speak Spanish or Laotian are in great need. A call has been placed by our office to the Tennessee Immigrant & Refugee Rights Coalition for possible resources and communication efforts.
